CELEBRATING

THE END OF AN ERA



In 2021 we said a fond farewell to our Board Chairman, Ray Taylor, who made the tough decision to retire after almost three decades leading our volunteer Board.

Ray has been an integral part of the Foundation's history since our establishment in 1991 (and even a few years prior when we were only a small idea).

So, we're celebrating the end of what has been a remarkable era with a small glimpse at what the Foundation has achieved during his tenure.

1991 - Darling Downs Health Services Foundation was established in June, with inaugural Chairman Michael Byrne, Deputy Chairman Ray Taylor and CEO Peter Rookas

1994 - we made our very first donation of a \$400 breast pump to the Toowoomba Hospital Maternity Ward

1996 - our name changed to what you now know as Toowoomba Hospital Foundation and in December, Health Minister Mike Horan approves our operational rights to manage the visitor car park, on-campus parking and coffee shop at Toowoomba Hospital

1998 - the Toowoomba Hospital visitor car park officially opens and the Toowoomba Hospital Children's Appeal is launched

1999 - Ray Taylor was inaugurated as our new Chairman

2001 - partnership with Pure Land Learning College begins and the idea of a research grants program is born

2005 - 4GRs Give Me 5 for Kids Appeal launches, raising funds for Toowoomba Hospital Paediatrics Unit

2011 - our community is devastated by a one in 100-year flood and Woolworths launches their first regional campaign to support local Paediatric Services with THF as their beneficiary in the Darling Downs

2015 - the Foundation gifts \$1 million, our largest ever single donation, to fit-out the Toowoomba Hospital Endoscopy Unit

2016 - we celebrate our 25th Anniversary, reveal our new logo and Peter Rookas retires as CEO, welcoming Alison Kennedy as the new Chief of THF

2019 - officially opened the Clive Berghofer Toowoomba Hospital Accommodation units in May and took over ownership of Wellbean Co in July

2020 - in July, the Foundation records its largest ever yearly contribution to Darling Downs Health gifting over \$2.5 million in grants for equipment, programs, research and staff development

2021 - successful in receiving a \$1.16 million Building Better Regions Grant for the Darling Downs Health Museum project and Ray Taylor retires after 30 years on the Foundation Board

Thank you to Ray for being an incredible advocate and champion of the Foundation, your guidance as our Chair will be greatly missed!

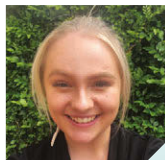


ALISON

2021 saw the Foundation reach its 30th birthday and my 25th anniversary

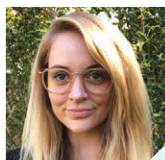

ZACH'S TRAGEDY INSPIRES HEALING

In March, we had the pleasure of officially opening the new Purpose-Built Outdoor Rehabilitation Garden at Baillie Henderson Hospital. The first garden of its kind for Darling Downs Health, this special project was valued at over \$255,000 and was made possible through the generosity of Suncorp Brighter Futures and the sponsors and attendees of the 2019 Women of Strength Luncheon.

The idea for the garden came from Zach Nightingale, who spent some time in the Rehab unit after a horrific motorbike accident in December 2017. Zach was passionate about the significance of nature and being outside as important parts of the healing process. Combining

this idea with advice from the Rehab team, this wonderful space was carefully constructed to incorporate elements that will assist patients with daily tasks and enhance physical and mental wellbeing. The garden has ramps, stairs, different walking surfaces, a letterbox, clotheslines and raised garden beds that are wheelchair accessible, all designed with the intention of helping patients get home sooner.

We are incredibly proud to have been a part of and helped fund such a special project for our health service. In a wonderful full-circle moment, Zach is now currently employed by Queensland Health, hoping to work in trauma patient support.

LEON'S LEGACY

On 10 December 2010, my dad, Leon Treadwell passed away from Appendix Cancer. During his 18-month battle of the deadly condition, Dad received weekly Chemo treatment at the Toowoomba Hospital. As much as he knew he needed to be there, he despised it. It wasn't a pleasant place to be, and he had a dream that if he was to survive his battle, he wanted to help others who had to go through cancer treatment too. Unfortunately, he was unable to fulfill his dying wishes.

Although dad may have left our lives, his hope and determination lived on in my mum and our family. As my dad was an avid golfer, with the help of Toowoomba Hospital Foundation and kind sponsors, we've had the privilege to put on the Leon

Treadwell Memorial Golf Day over the last 14 years. With funds going to the Oncology Unit, they have been able to purchase equipment and items, to help provide comfort to individuals receiving cancer treatment.

At the end of 2020, with dad by my side in spirit, I joined the THF team as the Receptionist. THF has been part of my life longer than the time I spent with dad, and it is an honour to be able to call it my workplace. From seeing how we raise the funds, to now seeing first-hand what is purchased with them, gives me reassurance that we are fulfilling his dream. Cancer may have taken him away, but he is with me every day I put my THF uniform on.



ON THE ROAD FOR RURAL HEALTH

You've got the itch to do some traveling, but interstate travel is tricky, international travel is still off the cards, and you're over visiting the same places. So, where do you go?

West, of course! In 2020 the Foundation launched its very first Great Western Road Trip in response to a growing demand for family-friendly COVID-safe events following the cancellation of many festivals across the region.

Our first road trip saw 32 vehicles and 80 participants from across Southeast Queensland travel to hidden gems and small communities throughout the Darling Downs, raising funds for rural health and supporting local businesses along the way.

And you loved it so much that in 2021 our foray into road tripping was added to our calendar of annual events, heading off on our second road trip with 50 cars and over 130 people!

Outstandingly, over the past two Great Western Road Trips our road trippers have raised over \$161,000 in support of rural health services!

Such an incredible effort! And we've only just recently approved over \$70,000 to go to Goondiwindi Hospital for staff training in the care of trauma patients and Nanango Hospital for a Sonosite PX point-of-care Ultrasound System.



TAKING TIME FOR **STAFF WELLNESS**



Each month, the Foundation hosts wellness activities that are free for all staff of Toowoomba Hospital, Baillie Henderson Hospital, and Mount Lofty Heights Nursing Home to attend. This year, the activities included creative DIY workshops, guided watercolour lessons, and 15-minute head, neck, and shoulder massages. The aim of the Staff Wellness Calendar is to promote

the importance of taking a break at work and offer all staff the chance to refresh their minds, bodies, and creativity.

A LITTLE HEART

WENT A LONG WAY



For many, 2020 could not have been any worse. But for Dalby man Danial Kirstenfeldt a global pandemic was just the tip of the iceberg when at 21 years old he had to undergo life-saving heart surgery in Brisbane to cure a rare cardiac condition.

As a teenager, Danial was diagnosed with Wolff-Parkinson-White syndrome, where an extra electrical pathway between the heart's upper and lower chambers causes a rapid heartbeat.

In 2021, Danial helped us launch our Annual Tax Appeal in aid of bringing an Electrophysiology Service, the same procedure he received in Brisbane, to Toowoomba Hospital.

With support of our Appeal Partner Harvey Norman Toowoomba, donations from our community and local businesses, we raised an incredible \$161,188 to go towards purchasing the equipment needed to make this service a reality for public patients in Toowoomba. Making this a first for public patients in the Darling Downs, who otherwise would have had to travel to Brisbane for treatment.

We couldn't be prouder of our community! Thank you so much for helping us make a lifesaving and life-changing difference to patients like Danial.

This year we also had the pleasure of welcoming our 2020 Tax Appeal donors and Ambassador Hannah to the Acute Mental Health Unit to see the new Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation (TMS) Machine they helped us purchase. This is the first time our health service can offer this alternative therapy to public patients, and it provides a walk-in / walk-out service with patients spending no longer than 45 minutes per session.

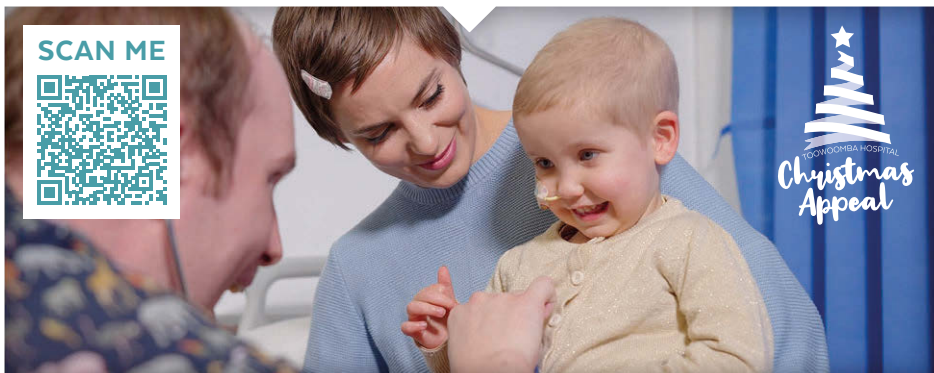
CHILDREN'S CANCER THIS CHRISTMAS

Each year in October, the Foundation launches the Toowoomba Hospital Christmas Appeal (THCA) to raise funds for an area of the Darling Downs Hospital and Health Service most in need at Christmas time. 2020's Christmas Appeal saw an incredible \$110,000 raised to purchase a new Anaesthetic Machine, supporting the vital work of the Toowoomba Hospital Theatre Department.

This year, we've been inspired by the extraordinary bravery of 2-year-old Ellie Ross and her mum, Karlie, after Ellie's shock Leukaemia diagnosis in January. Forming the heart of 2021's Christmas Appeal, we've launched the #100Kin100days campaign, aiming to raise \$100,000 before Christmas Day.

100% of funds raised from this year's appeal will go directly towards the Toowoomba Hospital Paediatric Oncology upgrade project. Currently, there are no specific facilities for children's cancer services at Toowoomba Hospital, and kids spend their time undergoing treatment in the Day Oncology Unit with adults. This makes an already scary journey for them and their families even tougher. \$100,000 will enable the current facilities to be upgraded to create a more welcoming and appropriate environment for our region's littlest and bravest patients, just like Ellie.

A NEW CHAPTER

IN OUR HISTORY

Toowoomba Hospital Foundation is embarking on an exciting new project – to construct a new medical museum that will pay homage to our health service’s history as well as become a place of culture and community for locals and visitors alike.

We have the plans, we have the location, and with thanks to a \$1.16 million grant through the Australian Government Building Better Regions Fund we now have a financial boost to start developing the Darling Downs Health Museum.

These funds will help get us onto the path of restoring and fitting-out the heritage-listed Medical Superintendent’s House at Baillie Henderson Hospital into a purpose-built museum space so our current and future collections can be displayed for everyone to see.

Stage 1 development will include:

- Refurbishing the heritage-listed Medical Superintendent’s House into galleries and storage facilities to display and house the museum collection
- The construction of a new 1118m² Amphitheatre
- Building new PWD (people with disability) access and amenities
- Providing vehicular access and car parking
- Fences, signage, and landscaping

In February this year, the Foundation was given 2 million reasons to celebrate as we marked 20 years of friendship with Pure Land Learning College.

Since our very first meeting in 2001, each year Pure Land Learning College with the blessing of their Venerable Master have donated \$120,000 towards medical research with 2021's donation ticking their generosity to \$2.4 million.

Their first donation helped us establish the Toowoomba Hospital Foundation / Pure Land Learning College Research Scholarships Fund for novice and professional researchers of Darling Downs Health.

Director of the Multi-Faith Multicultural Centre Pure Land Learning College, Haniff

Abdul Razak said the 20-year relationship was a great deal to Pure Land.

"This moment means a lot to Toowoomba Hospital Foundation and Pure Land Learning College because it represents the trust, confidence and the importance of our partnership that we've been growing over the last 20 years," he said.

"This partnership is more than just gifting money; it's about pooling all our combined resources and sharing what we have to benefit mankind and our community through the passion of healthcare and research."
