

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

We've been incredibly humbled by the support our community of donors, sponsors, volunteers, health service staff and first-time friends have shown us. Our Darling Downs Health Museum project is also moving along nicely having successfully achieved our tick of approval from Toowoomba Regional Council. In the new year our community can expect to see the restoration works begin at the Medical Superintendent's House at Baillie Henderson Hospital. We are beyond thrilled to bring our collection and the stories they hold to life. Watch this space!

- Guiding patients and visitors around the hospital when requiring assistance
- Retrieving and transporting documents throughout the hospital
- · Delivering mail to the Endoscopy and Paediatric Units
- Prepares pre-admission and day surgery packs in readiness for use by medical staff
- Provides comfort and care to patients waiting to be seen by medical staff

After being diagnosed with MS in 1994, Colin believes that we should all strive to give a little back in our lifetime.

His favourite part of volunteering is the social interaction at the hospital with staff, visitors, and patients.





Each year in April we launch our Tax Appeal to help raise funds for an area or unit of Darling Downs Health most in need, whether it be life-saving medical equipment, upgrades to a current facility or service, or to bring extra comfort to patients.

This year, our goal was to raise \$200,000 by June 30 to help purchase medical equipment, resources, and staff training so that you and your loved ones continue to receive the best possible care from the Toowoomba Hospital Emergency Department.

In 2021, the Toowoomba Hospital Emergency Department had over 63,000 presentations. That's more than half of the total Toowoomba population, and equal to 173 people through the Emergency doors every single day, around the clock.

To help spread our message, we invited some amazing local ambassadors to share their reallife emergency stories with us.

Thanks to the incredible generosity of our community, we smashed our \$200K goal and raised an unbelievable \$215,969.51! 100% of these funds will go towards supporting the life-saving work of the Toowoomba Hospital Emergency Department.

This wouldn't have been possible without the help of every single person who donated, came along to an event, raised funds on our behalf, and spread the word about our Tax Appeal. A special shout out to our Appeal Partner Harvey Norman Toowoomba and Media Partner 7NEWS Toowoomba for their generous support.





Following news of the sudden closure of the Millmerran Medical Centre, under the advice of our Chair Ray Taylor, the Foundation was keen to help a community who've given so much back to our health service.

The closure of the centre left residents and surrounding areas without access to primary health care services. At the time, Darling Downs Health stepped in and established a clinic at their health care facility in Millmerran.

While, behind the scenes, we set plans into action to purchase the existing centre in Campbell Street, with the goal to provide this vital service once again from a fit-for-purpose

building located next to the pharmacy in the centre of town.

The building was renovated to meet current standards and to ensure the comfort of locals visiting the clinic for care.

And in October this year the clinic started seeing its first patients thanks to the wonderful work of Darling Downs Health and Queensland Country Practice.

Through this partnership we are proud to have been a part of this project to ensure Millmerran and surrounding areas continue to have access to primary health care and the support they need.









Over the last 12 months the Millmerran Quilters Association has donated over 100 handmade quilts for the comfort of patients of Darling Downs Health. These donations include special baby cot quilts that are gifted to new babies born across our maternity wards as part of our Baby Book Bag initiative.





In 2019, the Weengallon Pink Ladies Day committee celebrated 20 years of their incredible breast cancer fundraising event. In 2020, the Foundation was honoured to have the opportunity to bring this event to Talwood as The Diamond Hunter Talwood Pink Ladies Day, raising funds for rural women's health services. But sadly, COVID-19 put a halt on all our event plans, including Talwood, and we made the tough decision to postpone the event until safer times. In 2021 we had to postpone again, thanks to continued border closures and travel restrictions, as well as extreme weather which caused flooding in the region.

Finally, on 24<sup>th</sup> August, 2022 the sun shone bright and we headed four hours west to Talwood, a tiny town with a huge heart.

Celebrating local creatives and artisans with market stalls and live entertainment, as well as inspiring local guest speakers, we welcomed over 500 women to the Talwood Oval for a fabulous day of shopping, lunching, and fundraising. And it was definitely worth the (very long) wait, as our wonderful guests, sponsors, partners, and the Talwood community raised an unbelievable \$68,132.05!

100% of these funds will go towards supporting Darling Downs Health Rural Women's Health Services across the region, including the BreastScreen Mobile Bus Service, Goondiwindi Hospital Maternity Ward, Kingaroy Hospital Gynaecology and Theatre Services, and Toowoomba Hospital Physiotherapy Service.









After many months, meetings, and amendments, Stage 1 of our Darling Downs Health Museum project hit its first big milestone achieving Development Approval from Toowoomba Regional Council.

With the project now going out to tender, the excitement and anticipation of finally starting on the restoration and refurbishment of the Medical Superintendent's House is now just round the corner.

Our community will start to see some movement on site from early 2023 as local contractors and heritage specialists begin the process of preserving the residence.

Stage 1 of the Darling Downs Health Museum, which includes the restoration of the Heritage-

listed house, the development of an outdoor grassed amphitheatre, and landscaping incorporating the protected trees, will be completed by January 2024.

Our vision for the Darling Downs Health
Museum is that it not only becomes a place to
preserve our history but a place of learning and
innovation. Where our community can see and
hear the stories of health and medicine from
across cultures and practices and how this has
shaped our hospitals and health services today.

As part of the Development Application, Stages 2 and 3 were also submitted to Council for approval. These Stages include an on-site café and offices; however, these will remain on hold until the Foundation can receive further funding to move forward



The Darling Downs Health Museum Stage 1 Project is funded by the Australian Government Building Better Regions Fund.

## THE MEDICAL SUPERINTENDENT'S HOUSE

The Foundation is fortunate to have been gifted the opportunity to restore and preserve the Heritage-listed Medical Superintendent's House on the grounds of Baillie Henderson Hospital.

This 19<sup>th</sup> century residence was built in 1888, coinciding with the construction of the main hospital site, for first Medical Superintendent Dr James Hogg and still retains many of its original features.

Located along Hogg Street, the residence will be carefully restored and refurbished to house our museum collection for our community and visitors alike to enjoy, ensuring this chapter of our medical history and the significance of this building lives on for future generations.


Your paver will be placed along the landscaped paths of the Darling Downs Health Museum. By dedicating a paver, you are showing your support, recognising the contributions so many have made

Make your own AROMADOUGH

Place water, salt and cream of tartar into saucepan and heat over medium heat until salt has dissolved. Allow to cool slightly and pour into mixing bowl.

To liquid mixture, add flour and oil and mix until combined.

Tip dough onto the bench and knead until the texture is consistent – soft and plyable.

Add essential oils and knead into the dough.

If using colouring, add a few drops of food colouring to the dough and knead the colour through.

Store in an airtight container to keep playdough from hardening.

In August, over 20 local trades, businesses, and contractors came together over 8 weeks to deliver what is now the Foundation's largest ever in-kind donation – the transformation of our Clive Berghofer Toowoomba Hospital Accommodation units.

Championed by the Order of Saint John of Jerusalem Knights Hospitaller Priory of the Darling Downs, the project was managed by Hutchinson Builders who took on the mammoth task of bringing our local community on board.

Originally opened in 1998, the six self-contained units provide little to no-cost emergency, short and long-stay accommodation for rural patients of Darling Downs Health needing to travel more than 50kms for treatment and care at Toowoomba Hospital.

Over the past two decades the units have been greatly valued by patients and their loved ones

and well-looked after by the volunteers who give their time to help run the accommodation. But they were in much-need of some TLC.

The Foundation was absolutely blown away by the outpouring of support from local businesses who gifted us their goods, services, materials, and labour totalling an incredible \$375,000!

Completely transforming the outdated units to modern, bright, and welcoming spaces with newly renovated kitchens, bathrooms, bedrooms and floors, including new paint, electrical, and furniture and white goods.

Thank you also to the CommBank Staff Foundation for their generous donation towards creating a welcoming place to stay for our patients.









As part of our commitment to supporting and enhancing the lifesaving and life-changing work of Darling Downs Health, each year we have the privilege of gifting grants to both novice (up to the value of \$10,000) and experienced (up to the value of \$50,000) researchers.

These grants are awarded to research projects that are of major significance to the health outcomes of the Darling Downs community and the treatment practices of health professionals.

Our research program is fortunate to have the support of Pure Land Learning College who

gift a generous donation towards making new research, discoveries, and treatments for our patients a reality.

In 2022, we awarded 10 grants across a wide variety of disciplines (see below).

In September 2021, we launched our very first #100Kin100days campaign as part of our overarching Christmas Appeal. Inspired by Karlie and Ellie Ross and The Ellie Project, we fundraised to upgrade the Toowoomba Hospital Paediatric Oncology services and help our region's littlest and bravest patients have a more welcoming, child-focused environment to receive care.

While this upgrade included the purchase of physical things like medical equipment, and child-specific items like change tables, it also included funding for bringing joy to the kids and

families undergoing long hospital stays. Being able to facilitate music therapy to the Paediatric Unit was a huge priority of Karlie's and we're thrilled to have been able to make this happen!

Now, the wonderful team from Maggie Moo Music Toowoomba visit the unit each fortnight with a treasure trove of musical instruments and fun, filling the ward with smiles, giggles and plenty of music. Thank you to everyone who donated towards our campaign to help bring these magical moments to patients, their families, and the staff of the Paediatric Unit.





Last year, we set our sights on raising \$100,000 to upgrade the Toowoomba Hospital Paediatric Oncology services in support of our littlest of patients fighting cancer and their families. As part of the #100Kin100days campaign and with the wonderful support of The Ellie Project and

their community we raised \$130,978.79 between September 16<sup>th</sup> and Christmas Day. The money raised from this campaign contributed to an unbelievable total of \$264,409.85 for our 2021 Toowoomba Hospital Christmas Appeal.







In November, local kids from across the Darling Downs were treated to a special visit from rugby league legend Greg Inglis who was in the region delivering his Goanna Academy MindEd program with thanks to funds raised by the Foundation and our mates.

Bringing the Goanna Academy to Queensland for the very first time, Greg visited Murgon State High, Warwick State High, and Stanthorpe State High schools and finished the tour with a footy workshop and mental health clinic at Kingaroy.

Through their schools program and community clinics, Greg is helping young people and their parents, carers and communities start

conversations with someone about mental health and equipping them with coping tools and tips should they find themselves struggling. Most importantly, the clinics are aimed at reducing the stigma in asking for help.

We are incredibly proud to have been able to support Greg and his Goanna Academy on their first tour of Queensland, right here in the Darling Downs. This wouldn't have been possible without our mates Fitzy's raising funds at their Fitzys Feast with Greg Inglis or our wonderful sponsors and guests at the Mort & Co Dinner with Greg Inglis in Dalby.
